Lightly sand your surface to create a smooth & absorbent canvas.

“GO WITH THE GRAIN”

Ir con el grano

Apply in the same direction as the grain, then backward against it. This allows the stain to soak into the wood and the coloring will look natural

“TWO COATS”

Dos abrigos


Always allow the coat to fully dry before applying the next. Two coats ensure a rich, smooth finish.
